April Character Trait: Sportsmanship

With springtime comes sports! Between baseball, soccer, golf, and softball, adults and kids alike will be talking non-stop about their favorite sports. With sports fever around, now can be a good a time as ever to reinforce the concept of sportsmanship. Sportsmanship can affect children both on and off the field and encourage them to explore the concepts of trust, self-esteem, and respect, among many other important traits.

One of the common myths is that teaching and enforcing sportsmanship is the sole responsibility of the coach. While the coach's job is to enforce the guidelines of sportsmanship, the real job of teaching sportsmanship starts at home. Look for these opportunities to teach sportsmanship to your child:

- Focus on fun. Whether they're playing soccer or gin rummy, the key here, especially for younger kids, is keeping the attention on the main idea: having fun. Remind kids that they should be enjoying themselves, making friends, learning new skills, trying a variety of sports, and discovering how to play cooperatively with teammates,
- Be aware of what kind of sport YOU are. Kids pick up on what is acceptable by watching how their parents behave. Think about how you respond when your favorite team loses or when you miss that shot on the golf course. Kids will see your sportsmanship when you encourage others for their success or when you cheer on a rival team when they make a particularly good play.
- **Emphasize graciousness.** Make sure your child congratulates the winner. It's not always easy to do, but it's so important to put a smile on your face, extend your hand, and say, "Good game."

How else can you demonstrate and practice this trait at home?

FSA Test Taking Tips

The night before:

- Help your child get to bed on time. Research shows that being well-rested helps students do better.
- Help children resolve immediate arguments before going to bed.
- Keep your routine as normal as possible. Upsetting natural routines may make children feel insecure.
- Mention the test to show you're interested, but don't dwell on it.
- Plan ahead to avoid conflicts on the morning of the test.

The morning of the test:

- Get up early to avoid rushing. Be sure to have your child at school on time.
- Have your child eat a good breakfast but not a heavy one. Research shows that students do better if they have breakfast before they take tests.
- Be positive about the test. Acknowledge that tests can be hard and that they're designed so that no one will know all of the answers. Explain that doing your best is what counts. The important thing is to make your child comfortable and confident about the test.

Mathematical Practices – Standard 7


Students often try to relate problems to questions or situations they have had in the past. Seeing and understanding how numbers and shapes work together to make patterns often creates some of the best problem solving situations. When students try to connect these mathematical ideas together they are looking for and making use of structure. Being able to take a step back and look at the big picture while problem solving often allows one to see that it is made up of several other tasks that may be solved individually.

Questions to Ask Your Child:

What are some other problems that you have solved in the past that are similar to this problem?

What patterns do you see?

What do you notice?
